



It seems that the updater to mLAN tools for OSX does not remove all the previously installed components. To insure that you have a properly installed mLAN system, you must remove all mLAN components and do a "Clean" Install.

Included a script that will uninstall all of the mLAN Tools.

The procedure to do this is as follows:

- 1: You must be the System Administrator (If you are the only user you are the administrator)
- 2: Launch the Terminal Program found in Applications/Utilities/Terminal
- 3: Copy and paste the text below the row of XX's
- 4: Reinstall the mLAN Tools

Copy and paste everything after the row of X's
